Information about the training Vital Villages

This training is an excellent opportunity to learn about successful models for Village Development Plans and Village Visions, to share experiences in this matter and to obtain useful skills and tools for community development. Vital Villages is highly relevant for paid and voluntary staff of rural development organisations and institutes for adult education.

Background

Since the 70th of the last century, the situation in many rural areas in Europe has dramatically changed. A process of accelerated decline took place: a severe decrease of inhabitants and facilities, weak infrastructure, less employment, unoccupied houses and buildings, increased poverty, groups suffering from social exclusion, etc. This was also the situation in Fryslân, the province where the training takes place. Inhabitants and provincial government, both wanting a liveable rural area, looked for ways to stop the

above-mentioned process. Together with community development workers, they searched for suitable actions in this situation. This was the start of the Village Visions. First the plans were rather rudimental, but with the years they developed towards almost professional Village Visions, made by the inhabitants themselves. Actual Village Visions cover a broad range of issues that are essential for the vitality of the village and suppose an active contribution of the inhabitants, including marginalised groups. Similar processes took place in other European countries, like UK and Denmark. As participation in village development requires a whole set of skills, education plays a key role in this process. This training will focus especially on Village Visions that promote a sustainable and inclusive rural area.

The training

Vital Villages consists of participatory lectures, study visits, practical exercises and peer consultation. Our staff has many years of experience in education and rural development.

After the training your staff will have insight in new tendencies and challenges in the rural area in Europe, in several models of Village Visions, in strategies leading to sustainable villages and to involve also the ageing population. Participants will experience that it is possible to stop the process of decline, to discover new perspectives for villages and their inhabitants and to realize new plans to increase liveability. Participants will learn form the strong involvement of volunteers and will have trained a set of relevant skills and tools. They will have insight in the role of municipalities, rural support organisations and public society. They have experienced 'the making of a Village Vision'. Through this training your organisation will be part of a growing network of persons and organisations active in Village Visions.

Learn for Life delivers the training in cooperation with Welziin Midden Drenthe and Doarpswurk (NL).

*The new Erasmus + Programme of the European Commission offers good opportunities for professional after-education as part of an organisational capacity building approach. Under this new framework, and different from the previous Grundtvig Programme, <u>organisations</u> and not individuals apply for grants. In the new Erasmus+ programme there is a strong emphasis on the impact on the organisation. If you want your staff - or volunteers who have a sustainable relationship with your work - to participate in an international course, you need to request financial support at your National Agency via the Application Form KA1 – Learning Mobility of Individuals (adult education).

Deadline for these applications is 17th of March 12.00 C.E.T.
